### ***Abstract***

It should provide a brief overview of the research and its objectives, and synthetically illustrate the methods, main results and key conclusions. There are no references, abbreviations, footnotes or notes in the abstract.*

**Keywords:** *Each manuscript has 3-5 keywords, separated by commas. Each keyword can be made up of one word (e.g. architecture, urbanism, etc.) or a syntagm (e.g. spatial planning, sustainable development, etc.)*

## **Title of paper in English**

### ***Abstract (in English)***

*The abstract in English should be compatible in content with the abstract in Serbian and should not exceed 300 words in length. It should have one paragraph.*

**Keywords (in English):** *translation of the keywords from Serbian*

### **1.0 Introduction**

The introductory section provides a broader context of the topic; it highlights the objectives of the research and the expected contributions. It also presents the issues and research motives, as well as the social and scientific justification of the research.

It is necessary, as a part of the introduction or as a special section, to give the theoretical background of the research, which connects it with similar previous research and explains its position in the broader theoretical framework. Special attention should be paid to the correct citation of all references used.

The introductory section should end with a paragraph describing the content and structure of the paper.

### **Section 2.0 (description of methodology/give an adequate title)**

This chapter has an explicative character; it represents a cross-section of the theoretical knowledge and previous results relating to the issue being addressed. The chapter describes in detail the research question/hypothesis and the methods used to support it. The method should provide sufficient data for anyone wishing to conduct similar research. Data on the research procedure are presented here, describing new methods and protocols in detail, while those already tested are briefly described with adequate citations.

### **Section 3.0 (presentation of the results/give an adequate title)**

This chapter highlights the most important scientific facts and results reached by the research, or those that are important for the theoretical interpretation of the chosen issue. It is a system of information, attitudes, theories and laws that prove the set hypotheses and presumed cause and effect relationships.

Illustrations should be inserted into the document as JPG files. Each illustration should be adequately marked (ordinal number, title in Serbian and in English) with a reference to it in the text (Fig.1). The titles should be placed below the figures.

Tables should also be adequately marked (ordinal number, title in Serbian and English) with a reference to the table in the text. Tables should be submitted as MS Word documents, not as images. Titles should be situated above the tables.

### **Section 4. 0 (discussion of the results/give an adequate title)**

This section deals with the results obtained in the research in terms of confirming the hypotheses. It points out the limitations in the methodology applied, and discusses the results and the way they can be interpreted in the light of previous research. This section should give definite solutions and measures for applying the results obtained in practice, as well as possibilities for future research.

### **5.0 Conclusion**

It gives the most important solutions to the issues presented and give answers to the questions posed in the first part of the paper. The conclusion presents the most significant findings that have already been provided in the results section in a systematic and concise manner. The conclusion is derived from the development of the paper, i.e. the results, without any new facts, evidence or information. Avoid citing other authors or using footnotes in the conclusion.

### **Acknowledgements**

If the paper is the result of a project, write the title and number of the project and state the institution financing it.

State the individuals or institutions that have provided tangible or intangible support to the research.

## **References**

The list of references contains all sources used in the paper. Each reference cited in the text should be present in the list of references, and all references from the list referred to in the text. References are listed in alphabetical order, in Latin script, and then chronologically. The Harvard style of citation is used.
